

contradict (v)	to <b>speak</b> against; to <b>say</b> the opposite
dictation (n)	what is written down as someone <b>says</b> it
dictator (n)	a leader who <b>speaks</b> and rules with total power
diction (n)	the manner in which something is expressed in words (written or <b>spoken</b> )
dictionary (n)	a reference book in which <b>spoken</b> or written words are defined
dictum (n)	a judge's ruling or <b>statement</b>
edict (n)	public <b>words</b> issued by an official that explain a law or command
indictment (n)	formal words <b>spoken</b> or written by a jury that charge a person with a crime
predict (v)	to <b>say</b> what will happen before it occurs
verdict (n)	the decision a jury makes in a trial; the decision <b>said</b> by the jury
